Florida USA Gymnastic State Judges Selection Guide

The Florida USA Gymnastic state committee is required to select all judges for Florida USA Gym state meets. State meets are not assigned by NAWGJ thru the assigners – Florida USA Gymnastics will use the services of Florida NAWGJ to send out contracts to all selected judges.

The Florida committee is also responsible to approve selection of Meet Referee and panels.

The Florida committee may determine and set up the process for selection of State meet judges.

Selection to a Florida State meet requires that you submit this availability form by September 1st along with an in gym card if you want to be considered for optional state meets.

Selection requirements

USAG and NAWGJ memberships must be current

CPE must be up to date

In gym card must either be filed with your regional availability or included with availability form by September 1st – you will need 6 hours of in gym hours at the level that you wish to be considered for assignment to an optional state meet (working with level 10 athletes will satisfy all levels). If you wish to be assigned to only compulsory state meets, you do not need to submit the in gym card. Affiliated judges may submit in gym hours from their associated gym – they do not need to go into other gyms to receive hours unless the gym does not have athletes at the level that you wish to be considered for.

Official NAWGJ uniform is required for all state meets.

150 Round trip mileage cap for all solo miles -Map quest is required for reimbursement using the shortest distance to the competition from your home - Car pool drivers will be reimbursed for full mileage. If a judge drives solo one way to a competition & car pools one way, the maximum mileage received for the solo trip will be 75 miles – full mileage would be received for the car pool miles.

Meals will be compensated by receipt only for the arriving night provided you are 3.5 hours or more from the meet site – map quest verification required to show time of your drive.

If a judge will not be able to arrive home by 7:00pm according to map quest and a meal has not been provided then per diem will be paid.

State meets are assigned based on level, location, CJ requirements as well as experience and professionalism displayed at competitions -

If you are not available for all dates offered, you are not automatically given a state meet on the dates that you are available. You may not receive as many state meets or possibly any state meet depending on your availability and what is needed for those meets.

Level 4/5 judges are encouraged to submit availability however due to a large number of level 7/8 and higher judges in the state you may not receive a state meet.

Judges that turn down a contract for a state meet after submitting availability will not receive a state meet the following season unless they inform committee before the contracts are sent out that they are no longer available (this is a regional rule as well).

All Assignments for all state meets will be completed by late September for the 2016-17 season.

All event assignments, report times and hotel information will be sent to State meet judges by Toni Rand.

If for any reason you need to pull off a state meet either for one day or the entire competition, you must inform Toni Rand as early as possible - Judges that cannot do the entire competition contracted for will be replaced for all of the days of that competition - All replacements will be made by the Florida selection committee and the meet referee.
